



Shell and Ryder cooperate in LNG vehicle expansion

Shell Oil Company has announced a new agreement with Ryder System, a commercial fleet and supply manager, for LNG heavy-duty vehicles supporting oil and gas logistics operations in the U.S.

The new 15 LNG fueled vehicles will replace Ryder diesel-powered vehicles in the existing fleet and will be serviced out of Ryder's Lafayette, Louisiana, facility. As part of the 5-year deal, Shell will supply LNG fuel for the dedicated natural gas fleet.
