



Australia: MIB Facilities completes new Caltex Lismore site

The site had been closed following the flood damage caused by Cyclone Debbie in 2017.

The old site was completely gutted and rebuilt. The project was extremely challenging due to the extensive damage caused by the Cyclone, local soil conditions, underground water and near record heavy rain encountered in October 2018, contributed to the difficulties faced throughout the project, MIB said.

The severity of the damage caused by Cyclone Debbie meant the site required a complete rebuild. MIB's team of engineers and tradesmen worked on the project to complete the rebuild and deliver a brand new, Caltex site. Works to the site included the demolition of site buildings, removal and demolition of old fuel storage tanks, shoring of excavations, dewatering of site, installing new fuel storage tanks, removal and replacing the site subgrade and damaged underground services, replacing the entire concrete forecourt, refurbishing the existing shop building internally and externally and to both levels. All works were completed in under 5 months.

With the works now complete, Caltex customers can now enjoy a new bigger shop experience offering; fuel, hot and cold food, coffee and a large variety of in-house grocery items. Caltex Lismore is the newest site to be opened in the vast Caltex network across Australia. The site has had a change of Management and will operate as a Caltex owned Starmart site.
