

Kho Hui Meng to retire as President & CEO of Vitol Asia

Mike Muller will succeed him and become Head of Vitol Asia.

Vitol announces that Kho Hui Meng, President & CEO of Vitol Asia, will be retiring on 30th September after 33 years with the company.

Mike Muller, who joined Vitol in 2018, will succeed him, become Head of Vitol Asia and assume responsibility for Vitol's business in Asia.

"I would like to thank our many customers across the region for their loyalty over many years. It has been an honour and a pleasure to work with them over the last three decades," said Kho Hui Meng.

New Head of Asia, Mike Muller, said: "I look forward to ensuring we continue to serve our customers as best we can, leveraging the global capabilities of Vitol to add value to their businesses."

Vitol is an energy and commodities company; its primary business is the trading and distribution of energy products globally – it trades 8 million barrels per day of crude oil and products and, at any time, has 250 ships transporting its cargoes.

Founded in Rotterdam in 1966, today Vitol serves clients from some 40 offices worldwide and is invested in energy assets globally including: circa 16mm3 of storage globally, 480kbpd of refining capacity and 7,000 service stations across Africa, Australia, Brazil, Eurasia and in Northwest Europe. Revenues in 2019 were \$225 billion.
